

Honolulu Bulky Item Collection Pilot

Beginning June 3, 2019, residents in metro Honolulu (Foster Village to Hawaii Kai) will be required to make appointments for collection of their bulky items. The regular monthly collection will not occur.

Consider Reuse options for your items before disposal:

There are numerous nonprofit organizations involved in reuse operations and some may provide pickup services. A donation of goods to a qualified organization with 501(c)(3) status may even provide a tax deduction for the donor.

Appointment Guidelines:

- Only one appointment per address can be made per month.
- Appointments can be made up to three months in advance.
- Description and quantity of items is required.
- **Single family homes** are able to dispose of up to five (5) bulky waste items.
- **Multi-unit residential buildings** must schedule appointments through your property management, AOAO or maintenance in order to consolidate appointments. Multi-unit dwellings are able to dispose of up to twenty (20) bulky waste items per appointment.
- Appointments can be made using the tool below or by calling 768-3200.

Drop-off options: If you are unable to wait until the next available appointment, drop-off options are available every day. Additionally, Keehi Transfer Station on Middle Street accepts combustible bulky items (no appliances) and household waste.
